Successful implementation of the Common Core State Standards requires parents, educators, policymakers, and other stakeholders to have the facts about what the standards are and what they are not. The following myths and facts aim to address common misconceptions about the development, intent, content, and implementation of the standards



The Common Core State Standards are not internationally benchmarked.



The Common Core State Standards have reduced parent influence on their children's education.



The standards were informed by the best in the country, the highest international standards, and evidence and expertise about educational outcomes.

The common core prevents students from achieving at the highest level by tracking them so they cannot take algebra in 8th grade.



Key math topics are missing or appear in the wrong grade.



Teachers were not involved in the writing process.



▶ The Standards were not field tested.



The evidence base includes scholarly research, surveys on what skills are required of students entering college and workforce training programs, assessment data identifying college- and career-ready performance, and comparisons to standards from high-performing states and nations.



The Common Core requires states to collect student data and provide information to the feds

▶ The standards tell teachers what to teach.



The Common Core is a state-led effort that is not part of No Child Left Behind or any other federal initiative.



Teachers will continue to devise lesson plans and tailor instruction to the individual needs of the students in their classrooms.



There are no data collection requirements for states adopting the standards.


