A partnership between middle school students and pre-service teachers.

Why Have Learning Partners?

Desire for pre-service teachers to see actual student work and have a chance to ask questions of that student. Middle school students have an audience for their work and to have an opportunity to find out more about college.

Procedure

- Mathematically rich problem is posed to both classes
- Only first names are used to protect both classes
- Students never meet or exchange contact information
- Papers are exchanged
- > Students are only required to write once
- > Comments are read before papers are exchanged
