FUNDAMENTAL QUESTIONS

Here are some fundamental questions you can use to explore students' responses:

- Tell me how you did that.
- Why is that true?
- How did you reach that conclusion?
- Does that always work? Why or why not?
- How could you prove that?
- What assumptions are you making?
- What would happen if...? What if not...?
- Do you see a pattern? What is it? Explain.
- How did you think about the problem?
- How is your method like his/hers? How is it different?
- How does this relate to...?
- What ideas that we've learned before were helpful in solving this problem?

When students are working together, you can ask questions like:

- What do you think about what James said?
- Do you agree? Disagree? Why? Why not?
- Does anyone have the same answer but a different way to explain it?
